

Have you bought your raffle tickets for the district "Riverboat Anchors" fundraiser? The drawing for the eight "Riverboat Anchors" will be held during the Awards Luncheon at District Convention on April 5th. There will be eight anchors with a total of \$2,000 in cash. Tickets are \$10 each or 4 for \$20. Each club is being asked to sell 40 tickets. If you have sold all 40 of your tickets, there is still time to get additional tickets – just call or e-mail me and I can drop them in the mail to you.

We received applications from 27 Pilot Clubs for the Georgia Pilot Foundation Scholarships this year. Each Pilot Club was eligible to submit either a GPF Anchor application or a Volunteer application. We will be awarding 8 scholarships at District Convention – 5 GPF Anchor Scholarships and 3 Lynda Goodwin Volunteer Scholarships.

In order to do this we need all Georgia District Clubs to participate in the district fund raiser. If every Pilot in the Georgia District purchased just \$20 in tickets, GPF could almost double the number of scholarships awarded.

We are hoping each club has also included a GPF donation in their club budget this year. If so, now is a good time to remind your club treasurer to mail in your club's donation. The GPF donation form is available on the Georgia Pilot website – pilotgeorgia.org.
