The Anchor Advisor/Sponsor is usually appointed by the school principal. The Anchor Coordinator is a member of the sponsoring Pilot Club. This person is appointed by the Pilot Club President and is the liaison between the Pilots and Anchors. This is a very important relationship which is critical to the success of any Anchor Club, and open communication is invaluable! You can learn so much by attending each other's meetings and also the planning of projects and activities shared by Anchors and Pilots. 
