



SOAR INTO SERVICE WITH BETTER LEADERSHIP

January is the time for nominating new District officers. In order for Katharine to have a successful year as Governor, she needs a good team of Pilot officers working beside her as she begins guiding Georgia District. By now a number of you have already said yes to leadership positions as Appointees. You are to be commended. In the April election we will need to fill the offices of Governor Elect, Secretary, Treasurer and five (5) Lt. Governors. If you are nominated, please say yes.

I have written in previous articles about the gualities of a leader and skills that build good leaders. A terrific opportunity is there for your taking. You all have unique abilities and talents just waiting to be shared with other Pilots. In my travel all over Georgia these last several years, I have gotten to know a lot of Pilots that are quite capable of stepping forward. From personal experiences I can say that holding offices on the club and District level has given me some of the most rewarding experiences of my life. If you have previously served as your club's president, you are eligible to move forward to the office of Region Lieutenant Governor. If you have experience in the financial field, Governor Elect Katharine needs you to run for Treasurer of Georgia District.

In the article, "Be A Better Leader, Have A Richer Life," Stewart D. Friedman identifies four domains in our lives as follows: Work, Home, Community, and Self (mind, body and spirit). He says, "Of course there will always be some tension among the different roles we play. But, contrary to the common wisdom there's no reason to assume that it's a zero-sum game. It makes more sense to pursue excellent performances as a leader in all four domains - achieving what I call 'four-way wins' - not trading off one for another but finding mutual value among them. Forsaking performance in one or more aspects of life can lead people to feel unfulfilled, overwhelmed, or stagnant." He calls the program he teaches in workshops around the world - Total Leadership.

We can learn a valuable lesson from his statement. Too often in our lives we will let one or more domains (usually family and work) monopolize our time to the extent that one or more of the others go lacking (usually self and community). Innately we all want our lives to give us a feeling of fulfillment and satisfaction. Growth in leadership may be the answer. With this said, I encourage you to seek an office in the Pilot organization this new year. Serving on the District level begins on the club level. Be willing to serve as an officer for your club in order to move forward.
