

I reside in Hart County, Georgia, where a sinkhole has been recently been discovered on a main road. The Georgia Department of Transportation believes the sinkhole was caused by a problem with a massive pipe that runs about 40 feet underneath the roadway. The pipe is 10 feet in diameter and 150 feet long. The pipe needs to be removed, replaced by a new, custom made pipe. Then the substructure for the route can be rebuilt. If that weren't complicated enough, each end of this huge pipe is under about 4 feet of Lake Hartwell water. Repair is expected to take the entire summer. Thinking about this dangerous situation, I thought about the potholes in my own life...

I found myself driving the curvy road near my home slower than usual this morning. My eyes were open as wide as I could get them and I was scanning the road as intently as I could. I was swerving my car to the left and to the right. No, I wasn't drunk, sick, or sleepy. I was just trying to miss all of the potholes. An especially brutal winter had produced a bumper crop of them this

As I rounded a curve I saw one that I couldn't miss. I hit it with a jarring thud and in a moment of anger one of those words I try never to use anymore slipped out of my mouth. I shook my head and slowed down even more. As I rounded another curve I saw a man in the road and slowed to a stop. He was directing traffic while his work crew was throwing shovels of asphalt into the worst of the potholes. I smiled at them all and gave them a little wave as I drove on. I knew that their patch job wouldn't last for long but was grateful that it was at least making the road a bit smoother for now.

As we all travel down the road of life we can't help but see that in places it is full of potholes. Pains and problems, difficulties and troubles, challenges and obstacles, sickness and death all lie along that rough road. There is no way to ignore them. There is no way to avoid them. There is no way to travel around them. What we are left with then is a choice. We can curse their existence and rail at God and life or we can take a shovel full of kindness, a shovel full of joy, and a shovel full of love and do our best to fill them in. We can work and pray and have faith that we are making the road a little less rough for those who follow us. And we can remember that while God didn't promise us a smooth road in this life He did promise to help us to smooth the road ourselves, one pothole at a time.

Hello Pilots!



Conyers Club Partners with Autism Support Group

In its desire to DO MORE and consistent with Pilot International's focus- Caring for Families, The Pilot Club of Conyers, GA. wrote and received a 2014-15 matching PIFF grant for \$1500. The funds are being used to celebrate and support a very special group of Family Caregivers in our county, The Autism Support Group. Very briefly, the grant allows free time to these parents with five planned activities over the year. Pilots are hosting three dinners with programs for the parents while their children's needs are met by certified sitters and Pilot members. Two Parents' Nights Out allow caregivers three hours free time while their children play on inflatables and enjoy pizza at Game Time. Staff, Pilots and sitters provide supervision at Game Time which is closed to other guests during this time.

Our first dinner was held on May 15th and exceeded all expectations. Thirty four care givers and thirty one children attended! To welcome summer, we planned an evening of fun and fellowship for the caregivers and selected the theme, WE CELEBRATE YOU. The evening included a catered dinner, a hilarious visit from Granny Cupcake, a soloist, and games with great donated prizes. While the parents enjoyed some adult time, the children ate and played games in another well supervised area of the church where the event was held.

Ginny Van Rie, Chairman of the Rockdale Autism Support Group, says it best, "The partnership with the Pilot Club through the grant has been invaluable. The dinner and entertainment was wonderful. The parents/caregivers were able to enjoy a delicious catered meal with entertainment knowing that their children/dependents with autism spectrum disorders (ASD) or other disabilities were safe and entertained which allowed the parents to actually relax during the evening. We (RCASG) can only provide this level of service for the parents/caregivers through the support of the Pilot Club! We are very grateful they chose our organization and families to honor and support with the grant!"







Pick Me Ups and Caregiver Recognition

The Pilot Club of Carrollton recognized twelve community Caregivers and their guests at its May meeting at Sunset Hills Country Club. The club treated the 24 guests to dinner and presented them with gift cards from the club and gifts from three local businesses.
