To get off to a good start toward making your club Soar into Service, take time for each club division to meet to make good, doable plans with a member of the division in charge of each project. Remember plans are not set in stone and may have to have changes made from time to time. When a project is completed, it is always a good idea to do an evaluation to see if there are ways to improve it for next time.

When you plan your club budget, remember that your club has the privilege of being a part of a District in Pilot International. As such, all clubs are expected to participate in PI and District activities. All club budgets should have line items for \$250 Goal for Grants and Scholarships; \$10 per member for Pacesetter; Money for International Convention representation; \$100 for Georgia Pilot Foundation; Registration Fee and expense money for District Fall Council and Spring Convention; money to send officers to the region workshop and a contingency fund for unexpected expenses. Plan adequate fundraisers to earn the money you need to operate over and above the dues collected. No excuses please...... It is a fact of human nature that we will find a way to do or get whatever we really want! If, we are willing to work hard enough to make it happen, we will succeed.

I learned a long time ago that life is not all sunshine and roses. I have to work for what I have. The same goes for having a successful Pilot Club year. There is so much joy in doing for others.

May.... you Soar into Service as you Spread the World with Happiness.



Hello Pilots, if you were in attendance at District Convention you heard me briefly speak about each of our Georgia Pilot Foundation Anchor scholarship winners and the Lynda Goodwin Volunteer scholarship winners. I said that day that I would submit to the next Governor's Bulletin a more in depth account of each or our winners. We had nine applicants for the Volunteer scholarship and seventeen for the Anchor scholarship. Each scholarship is worth \$1,500 and we forward this money directly to the college of the student's choice.

First I will introduce you to our GPF Anchor scholarship winners.

**Britt Pentecos**t, will graduate from Winder-Barrow High School, Winder, GA. She plans to attend Georgia College in Milledgeville. She will be studying Sports Psychology. Her current GPA is 4.0 and she is ranked 24<sup>th</sup> out of 386 students.

**Brittany Tran**, will graduate from Madison County High School, Madison, GA. She has been accepted to both Mercer University and University of South Carolina, she is undecided as to which she will accept. She will be studying Biological Sciences (pre-med track). She hopes to become a cardiothoracic surgeon. Brittany's GPA is 3.9252. She stands 9<sup>th</sup> out of a class of 268.

**Aspen King**, will graduate from Putnam County High School, Eatonton, GA. She plans to attend UGA and study Animal Science/pre-Veterinary. She wants to become a veterinary. Aspen's GPA is 3.9. She stands 6<sup>th</sup> out of a class of 141.
