


MESSAGE FROM OUR GOVERNOR

"We must make the world a place where love dominates our hearts Nature sets the standard for beauty


Simplicity and honesty are the essence of our relationships Kindness guides our actions and everyone respects one another.".

DISTRICT TREASURER



All Pilot Clubs are required to file a Form 990, 990EZ or file the electronic 990N between July 1 and November 15 of each year. The filing of the form is based on the annual gross income. Gross income means the amount of income for the year for the organization and any other parts of the organization if those parts use the same EIN as the club (i.e.: If your Anchor Club uses your EIN, you must include their receipts too.) Gross income includes everything taken in including dues, fundraising revenue, contributions, interest, etc. If the gross income is less than \$50,000, the club must file a form 990N electronically. You may find the form on-line at www.irs.gov or https://epostcard.form990.org. This form must be filed every year by every club!!! The fiscal year should be July 1 to June 30.

Once you have completed the filing of Form 990 or 990N, print a copy of the form or confirmation that you have filed. Keep a copy with your Treasurer's records and email me that your club has filed.

Reminder to all club Anchor Coordinators – Georgia District dues in the amount of \$8.00 per Anchor member should be sent to Georgia District Treasurer, Avaline Adams – 4940 Hwy 145, Carnesville, GA 30521. Pilot International dues in the amount of \$14.00 (dues-\$10 + \$4 insurance) per member are to be sent to PI Headquarters with their corresponding forms found at https://pilotgeorgia.org under Anchor tab. Deadline is on or before November 1, 2018. Copies should be mailed to Kerrin Daniel, Georgia District Anchor Coordinator.

LEADERSHIP

"The art of communication is the language of leadership." —James Humes

Developing communication skills is key to effective leadership. A leader must be able to share knowledge and ideas, to inspire and to encourage. Here are a few tips to develop your communication skills:

- Know your audience. A good communicator adapts their style to the situation. Are you speaking to a single person, or to a group? Are you speaking to fellow Pilots, or to potential members? This doesn't mean just telling people what they want to hear, but telling them what they need to
- Learn body language. If you can read nonverbal cues (hand gestures, posture, facial expressions), you can tell how they are receiving your message before a word is said. And your body language can show your audience your confidence in your message, sometimes even more than your words.

NOTES FROM THE PARLIAMENTARIAN

Recently two questions of Parliamentary Procedures have been frequently asked. I will attempt to respond to these questions and hopefully help leadership understand the importance of each in one's club meeting, executive board meetings, and or committee meetings. The first questions: Can a meeting be conducted without a quorum? answer is No. If there is no quorum Robert's Rules of Order (11th edition) tells us that any business transacted (except for procedural actions) are null and void. It is the responsibility of the presiding officer or committee chairman to determine prior to the meeting it there is a quorum. It is permissible to wait a brief time before starting the meeting for additional persons to arrive. If after a reasonable period, there is no quorum the presiding officer or committee chairman may call the meeting to order and indicate that there is no quorum. The chair may entertain a motion to recess in an attempt to obtain a quorum or a motion may be made to reschedule the

meeting. Once one of the motions is carried the chair may then ask for a motion to adjourn the meeting. Doing business without a quorum cannot be waived. A note to all clubs is to be sure that your Standing Rules addresses what is considered a quorum.

The second question raised: Can we hold our board meeting by conference telephone call? You may hold board meetings by conference specifically authorize you to do so. If they do, sufficient notification must be given to all attendees. Such meetings must be conducted in such a way that all members participating can hear each other at the same time, and rules should be adopted to specify the equipment required to participate, as well as methods for seeking recognition, obtaining the floor, submitting motions in writing, determining the presence of a quorum, and taking and verifying votes.


- Listen. Communication is a two-way street. A good leader listens to what others say, and lets them know that their opinions matter. And you might just learn something!
- Admit your mistakes. You will make mistakes, but if you don't own up to them, you can lose credibility as a leader.


Effective communication skills don't always come naturally. But they can be learned with practice.
