

PARLIAMENTARIAN MESSAGE

Have you ever wondered---WHY PARLIAMENTARY PROCEDURE???

In our Pilot International Bylaws, Article XXXVIII Parliamentary Authority, it states that the current edition of ROBERTS RULES OF ORDER, NEWLY REVISED will govern Pilot where they apply and are not inconsistent with these bylaws and any special rules of order which Pilot International may apply.

If you think parliamentary procedure is boring or outof-date, then you're probably not alone. So why DO we use parliamentary procedure?

At the heart of parliamentary procedure is the rule of the majority with respect for the minority. The object is to allow deliberation or debate questions of interest to the group; in our case Pilot, it is to reach group decisions-usually by vote-with the least possible friction. Miss Manners would probably say it is just common courtesy! The next time your club has a business meeting, remember to be courteous and kind by following parliamentary procedure. It may still be a bit boring, but courtesy and kindness are never out-of-date. Be sure to check ROBERTS RULES when there are questions, and apply them with kindness.
