

November is also a month to conduct Pilot business. For clubs located in the United States, *November 15* is the deadline for ALL clubs to report to IRS regardless of amount of income. Detailed information on which Form 990 applies to your club is in the Club Manual on the PI website. Clubs failing to report to the IRS for three consecutive years will lose their tax-exempt status. Club treasurers must maintain accurate records at all times should the Internal Revenue Service require further information on the financial activities of the club/district.

Let's welcome November and focus on what we have and what we can do for others!




