

A club can be defined as a built-in social network of likeminded individuals who get together for the same cause or reason. Does that sound like your Pilot Club? Hopefully, yes, it does. Clubs are a great way to do things you like to do with other people. A typical Pilot likes to help people in their community. They see a project that needs to be done, or they see a person who could use a little assistance and they get people together to do it. Clubs add value to the community. But, just like a business it needs to be cared for. Thus, we have committees for purposes...projects, fundraising, membership. Without membership, we have no club. Membership should be approached in a way similar to projects and fundraisers- it is just as important.

Attracting and retaining members is a challenge. Create a range of opportunities for people to participate at times that are convenient for them. Host many open opportunities to introduce others to your club's activities, to break down barriers, and to make it easy to become involved. Flexibility, convenience, and enjoyment will participation.

Marketing is vitally important in building a club and should be simultaneously carried out by word of mouth, social media, email, posters, flyers, billboards, or hosting a local event.
