INSPIRATIONAL MESSAGE



During this Holiday Season, three holidays share the significance of candles and light. When you light a candle in a dark room at night, oh you can see so much more. Light makes a difference according to where and how it is used.

<u>Christmas</u>, a candle, is a mirror of starlight and is a symbol representing the Star of Bethlehem. The star guided the Magi to the stable where Jesus was born. Jesus is called "the Light of the World" by Christians. This might have started the custom of the Advent Candles. Also, the Christmas trees were decorated with candles to light up the tree before electric tree lights were invented.

Hanukkah, the Festival of Lights in Judaism, the Jewish people revolted against the Greeks, won, and liberated Jerusalem where they could worship in their Temple. The celebration began by lighting the menorah with only one day's worth of oil, which miraculously lasted eight days. Modern-day Jewish families recite blessings and light candles on each of the eight nights of Hanukkah.

<u>Kwanzaa</u>, a unity celebration of people displaced during the African dispersion, where one candle of the kinara candle holder is lit over seven nights. This represents a tree of life and serves as a reminder of people's ancestors. The seven candles represent seven principles (values) and focuses on one value every night.

Our light as Pilots can create excitement and strength that helps bring happiness and encouragement to fade the darkness to the lives we touch and serve. We all are the light of the world and need to let our light glow daily.

Wishing you a Merry Christmas, Happy Hanukkah and a Happy Kwanzaa,





Anchors-Neon 80's is the theme this year, so you may want to include a few colorful items in your wardrobe over the holidays to sport during the Friday night welcome session!
