

Happy New Year Pilots -- hoping you opened the front door for all the excitement of 2025 to sweep right on it while you swept 2024 right out the back door!! Truly I do hope for each of you joy and laughter for 2025!! The Lord's plans are for good! Relax and rest in them.

I had hoped to have the Valentine's Day getaway pulled by January 1, but a couple of members say they still have tickets. Please send all tickets to me at 1510 Newcastle St, Brunswick 31520!!! I need to pull by January 15th so the winners have time to plan their trip. Remember it is for three nights and four days in Daytona -- same weekend as the Daytona 500 for those car racing buffs! The tickets are ten dollars each or three for twenty. This money goes to District to help with needed projects.

PIFF is our international foundation -- it is to help us!! However, the only way for it to succeed is to help the foundation!!! We (Georgia District and PI) need each club to send in its 250 commitment (\$250). This earns the District status as a 250 District as well as ensuring you grant money when you apply. Truly it is a win-win situation. You can apply for a pick up grant for \$250 (therefore gaining your \$250 back to use toward a pick up project); you can apply for a helmet grant (matches you one for one or if out of helmets at PI, will send you the money to purchase from the company -- again getting your \$250 + back); you can apply for matching funds toward a special project you have in mind. In any event the money you shelled out comes flying back to you ---- win-win for all!!

Governor Maureen would really like for Georgia to be a 250 District! Please look at your budget to see what you can do --- have a special fund raiser, have a fifty fifty drawing during your club meeting, collect change at every meeting, ask everyone to pay a dollar for each year she/he has been a member (older members understand and newer members will not have to pay but two or three dollars!), have at a meeting raffle with each member bringing something to raffle or auction, consider adding five dollars to your club dues to cover the cost (now or next year), ask a business to sponsor the foundation, ask a club member to sponsor. You would be surprised when asked, the members willing to help. If all resources fail and you can show, then contact Maureen. We do have Pilots willing to help other clubs with matching funds. We want to be a 250 District but need your help!!
