

GEORGIA PILOT FOUNDATION (GPF)

The Georgia Pilot Foundation / Georgia District Pilot / Georgia District Anchor Partnership

GPF was originally part of the GA District Pilot. Scholarships were awarded to GA District Anchors from the GA District. To enhance the capabilities of scholarships for Anchors and to add to the flexibility to support the GA District, the scholarship function was moved from the 501(c)(4) GA District to a new separate entity 501(c)(3) GA Pilot Foundation. GPF became a supporting partner for the GA Dist and GA District Anchor. Note that GA District Anchor is part of GA District Pilot.

This partnership opened the door for GPF to increase the number of scholarships awarded to qualifying GA District Anchors and to support GA District. Reciprocally, GPF relies upon GA District for support not only to assist in fundraising for GPF scholarships, but also to perform the management and administrative duties of GPF. The origination of GPF also offered the opportunity to reach out in service to all Pilot Club Communities, not just clubs that sponsor an Anchor Club, through the establishment of the Lynda Goodwin Volunteer Scholarship.

To leverage the opportunities of the GPF / GA District / GA District Anchors Partnership, GPF is increasing the GPF Annual Fundraisers from one to three: 1) \$250 Raffle (existing), 2) The Duck Race, and 3) Virtual 5K. GPF will also sponsor a Virtual 5K for the GA District. The proceeds from this Virtual 5K will go to the GA District to be used as the GA District needs.

The method to this madness is to ultimately not only increase funds raised, but to expand fundraising outside of the GA District. And to raise funds during the year prior to year that they are used for scholarships. Example: Funds raised during the 2024-2025 year would be used for scholarships during the 2025-2026 year. Currently we are raising funds in the same year that we are spending them.

Thank you for your support through the years. And thank you in advance for your ongoing support as we continue to grow in our support of our communities.


